From Our Pastor



A few weeks ago, Liam and I had the opportunity to head back to Kansas to spend some time helping my dad and brother on the farm. It had been a while since I had climbed into a tractor or spent long days in the fields, but some things never leave you. The smell of freshly turned soil, the rhythm of machinery moving across the fields, and the quiet conversations shared over sandwiches in the pickup all have a way of bringing you home.

As we worked together, I was reminded that farming has always been about more than raising a crop. It is about faith. Every season begins with hope. You prepare the ground, plant the seed, tend the fields, and trust that, in time, life will emerge. There are storms you cannot control, dry spells you cannot prevent, and setbacks you never expected. Yet every morning you get up and keep doing the work that is before you.

That trip has stayed with me because I think it echoes Jesus' words in the Sermon on the Mount: "You are the salt of the earth."

Salt isn't flashy. It doesn't draw attention to itself. In fact, when salt is doing its job well, you hardly notice it. Yet without it, food is bland, preservation is lost, and something essential is missing. Salt quietly brings out the goodness that is already present.

I wonder if that is exactly what Jesus had in mind for those who follow him.

We live in a world that often feels overwhelmed by division, anger, and violence. It can seem as though every headline invites us to choose sides, harden our hearts, or retreat into fear. The temptation is to believe that only louder voices or bigger gestures can make a difference.

But Jesus offers another way.

To be the salt of the earth is to season our communities with compassion. It is to preserve what is good when cynicism threatens to erode it. It is to bring healing where relationships have become fractured and hope where despair has settled in. Often this happens not through grand acts, but through ordinary moments of kindness, listening, forgiveness, generosity, and welcome.

At Agnus Dei, I see this kind of "salty" faith every week. I see it in the meals shared, the prayers offered, the quilts stitched, the advocacy for our neighbors, the laughter over coffee, and the quiet acts of care that rarely make the front page but faithfully reveal the love of Christ. Together, these simple acts become a witness to God's kingdom, a kingdom where mercy is stronger than fear, love is greater than hate, and peace is always possible.

My dad has often reminded me that every field is tended one pass at a time. You don't harvest an entire crop in a single sweep. You simply keep showing up and doing the next faithful thing.

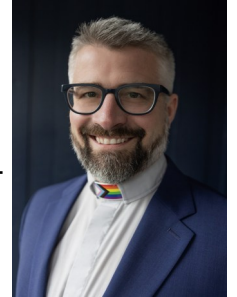
Perhaps discipleship is much the same.

Jesus doesn't ask us to fix the whole world by ourselves. Instead, Christ calls us to be salt, to faithfully season the little corner of the world entrusted to our care. As we do, God's Spirit works through our ordinary lives in extraordinary ways.

May we continue to be a community that brings out the goodness in others, preserves hope in difficult times, and reminds our neighbors that God's love is still at work in the world.

President's Message

Have you wanted to have a greater voice in what is going on in our national government? It may seem impossible that your voice and action can make a difference, but when combined with many other voices we can make a difference. I joined the **ELCA Advocacy Group** this year. Here is what they want to achieve: *Our ministry of advocacy is a witness to God's love for our neighbor, ourselves and for all creation.* When you join the group you will receive sign-on letters in your email developed by the ELCA Witness in Society staff on legislation that is moving through the House or Senate that impacts our nation. You can add language to the letter or adopt it as written and send it to your local representative and senators. By adding your voice along with the many other ELCA members we can encourage them to pass legislation that will show love to our neighbor, ourselves, and all of creation.

Please consider joining the network so we have a greater voice in our national government.

I am filled with gratitude for the generosity in the donations you have given to the **Freedom To Serve Campaign**. We have exceeded our stretch goal of receiving \$200,000 by August 1st when we refinance our mortgage. Funds can come in until August 3rd but at the time of writing this article we have received \$237,890 by the August deadline and total pledges for the whole campaign of \$260,984. Our new mortgage payment with the downpayment will allow us to save more than \$24,000 a year in our budget. Thank you!

Highlights from the July Council Meeting:

- ◇ Reviewed the Little Lambs financials (July 1st – June 30th). Income in excess of expenses for the fiscal year is \$33,520. With this great financial news there is a recommendation to approve a 10% donation (\$3,352) to the ADLC general fund.
- ◇ Accepted reports from the Council Committee Liaisons and acted as necessary on requests.
- ◇ Reviewed the ADLC fiscal year finances (February 1st – June 30th) that shows income less than expense by \$24,079. **Please review the complete financial report on the next page.**
- ◇ Approved DeDe Boerger to serve a 3-year term on the Personnel Committee.
- ◇ Approved moving the balance of the Chair Affair Funds (\$2,272.27) to the Freedom to Serve Campaign.
- ◇ Approved with gratitude the donated storage shed from Heron's Key to be used for storage of the hard-to-recycle items.
- ◇ Approved refinancing the ADLC mortgage with MIF at a rate of 7.175%.
- ◇ Heard a report from Pastor JT on the One Parish One Prisoner program and recommended the program be presented at a future Adult Forum to see if there is interest at ADLC to participate.
- ◇ Welcomed guests Erin Welch and Ithan from Key Peninsula Community Services to hear their request for ADLC to become an **Inclement Weather Location**. Approved a motion for ADLC to trial for a year being an Inclement Weather Location during the day (Mondays – Thursdays from 9:30 to 4:30 PM) during the summer only.

What does it mean for ADLC to be an **Inclement Weather Location** for Key Peninsula Community Services (KP)? When the temperature exceeds 84 degrees F or below 32 degrees for extended periods, KP alerts their clients that they are welcome to go to an Inclement Weather Location to cool down or warm up and take a moment to refresh. The Council approved ADLC being used as a location only in the summer because Little Lambs is in session during the winter. KP clients will be welcome to cool down in the Parish Hall, charge their phones and drink water provided by KP. It is uncertain how many people may use this service but it helps that ADLC is on the bus line. More information is to come if you want to volunteer to help with this program. Anticipated start is in August once the congregation is informed of the program and protocols are put in place.

Baby Kits for Lutheran World Relief in July

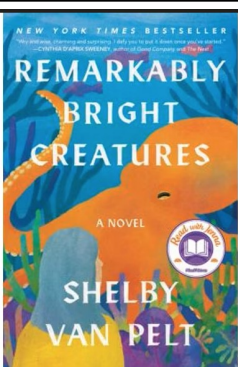
